Whereas, since Governor Cuomo's 2017 announcement of this joint effort to bring economic development and tourism to the area of the Upper Hudson Recreation Hub, there is a new New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Campground known as Frontier Town Campground, Equestrian and Day Use Area, a new Brewery known as the Paradox Brewery and a new private owner of the A-Frame site on the Master project site; and

Whereas, as the project moves into the next phase of critical development the Town Board of the Town of North Hudson strongly urges New York State Legislators and Governor Cuomo to commit to the completion of its vision and continue to this Gateway Project forward; and

Be it Resolved, in order to promote tourism and a better visitor experience and to provide economic development the Town Board of the Town of North Hudson is encouraging the New York State Legislators and Governor Cuomo to provide State funding for the next critical phase of the Gateway Project; and

Be It Resolved that the Town of North Hudson Town Board hereby introduces proposed Local Law No. #2 of 2020 entitled “A local Law to Override the Tax Levy Established in General Municipal Law §3-c,” reading and provided as follows:

“Town of North Hudson Local Law No. 2 of 2020”

A Local Law to Override the Tax Levy Established in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Be It Enacted, by the Town of North Hudson Town Board as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the intention of this local law to override the limit on the real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of North Hudson pursuant to General Municipal Law § 3-c, and to allow the town of North Hudson to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2021 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of “tax levy limit” as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

Section 2. Authority.

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town of North Hudson to adoption of a local law approve by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.

Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override- Budget Authorization

The Town Board of the Town of North Hudson hereby overrides the tax levy limit for the Town of North Hudson hereby overrides the tax levy limit for the Town of North Hudson for 2021 and authorizes the Town of North Hudson, after completing all required procedures for the adoption of a budget for 2021 that requires a tax levy that is greater than the tax levy limit calculated for 2021 pursuant to §3-c of the General Municipal Law.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgement shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm, or corporation, or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgement or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Be it Further Resolved that the Town Board of the Town of North Hudson shall hold and conduct a public hearing on the foregoing proposed local law on the 5th day of November, 2020 at 5p.m. in the forenoon of that day, to hear any and all persons concerning the same, and
